What is Universal Screening?

Universal screening systematically assesses ALL students for behavioral/social-emotional risk, allowing early identification and intervention before problems become severe.

Screening Implementation Checklist

Planning Phase

- Leadership support secured
- Screening tool selected (validated, appropriate)
- Timeline established (fall, winter, spring)
- Staff training scheduled
- Parent notification planned
- Data system prepared

Tool Selection Criteria

- Validated for your population
- Efficient to administer
- Provides actionable data
- Integrates with MTSS framework
- Cost-effective

Common Screening Tools

Tool	Type	Time	Focus
SRSS-IE	Teacher rating	2-5 min	Externalizing/Internalizing
BESS	Multi-rater	5-10 min	Broad behavioral
SDQ	Multi-rater	5 min	Strengths & difficulties
SAEBRS	Teacher rating	1-3 min	Social-emotional

Using Screening Data

1. Identify students at risk (score above cut-off)
2. Gather additional data on at-risk students
3. Match intervention intensity to risk level
4. Monitor progress more frequently for at-risk
5. Re-screen at next benchmark period

Risk Tiers

Tier	Risk Level	Action
Tier 1	Low risk	Universal supports; continue monitoring
Tier 2	Moderate risk	Targeted intervention; increase monitoring
Tier 3	High risk	Intensive intervention; individual planning

Family Communication

- Inform families of screening purpose and process
- Explain how data is used
- Share results with concern for individual students
- Connect to intervention supports

Pro Tip

Screening identifies risk, not diagnosis. Students flagged need additional assessment to determine appropriate supports.
